FAITH LIFE QUESTION: How did God make me special? UNDERSTANDINGS

- God gave me my own unique gifts.
- It is our choice to help our gifts from God to grow.

Inquiry - Science

COMPELLING QUESTION - How is sound made?

UNDERSTANDINGS

- · Sound is made through vibration.
- Pitch is how high or low a sound is.
- Loudness is created with energy.
- There are different ways to make sounds.
- Different materials make different sounds.



Social and Emotional Learning

The Year 1s and 2s will be exploring the question: How can I be a carrier of HOPE?

Understandings:

- Hope means believing that good things can happen to you, to others, or in the world.
- When you feel confident and believe in yourself, it's easier to stay hopeful.
- Hope helps you keep going, even when things are tough—like having problems with friends or finding schoolwork hard.
- People who have hope know it's okay to ask for help.
- Talking to trusted adults or friends about your problems can help you feel more hopeful and supported.







English

READING AND VIEWING

The students will:

- explore the features of folktales: fables and fairy tales
- · explore the characters and settings within folktales
- · retell and summarise texts
- decode unfamiliar words through segmenting and blending known sounds
- read a familiar text fluently using a steady pace, expression and accurately decoding words
- answer literal (Who? What? Where? When?) and inferential (Why?) comprehension questions about a familiar text
- define unknown vocabulary from the class text
- identify features of narrative texts (Year 2).

PHONICS (30 minute sessions 5 times a week) UFLI Foundations (Phonics)

In Year 1, the students will explore:

- ing, tch and dge
- y as the i and e sound
- · syllables within words
- word endings of -ild, -old, -ind, -olt, -ost.

In Year 2, the students will explore:

- oi and oy
- ou and ow
- silent letters: kn, wr, mb
- low frequency spellings, such as ar, air, ear and ough
- suffixes and prefixes: s and es; er and est; less and full and un, pre and re.

WRITING

The students will:

- construct sentences, which are cohesive and demonstrate an understanding of grammatical conventions
- write a retell of a fairy tale (Year 1)
- write a narrative text (Year 2), including an introduction (beginning), problem (middle) and solution (end)
- practise letter formation to encourage legible written text
- use the strategy of 'CUPS' (Capitalisation, Understanding, Punctuation and Spelling) to edit to improve their writing (Year 2)
- use a writing plan to develop their ideas (Year 2).

GRAMMAR

In Year 1, the students will:

- · develop questions using who, what, where and when
- use subordinating conjunctions, such as if, when, before, after
- identify and use pronouns in sentences.

In Year 2, the students will:

- identify and use pronouns in sentences
- write compound sentences
- experiment with using commas in sentences
- explore low and high modality words
- use regular and irregular verbs and nouns in sentences.

SPEAKING AND LISTENING

- listen to the speaker in understanding their role as the audience
- use active listening and show interest, by contributing ideas, information and asking questions
- make short presentations speaking clearly, using appropriate voice, pace, text structures and language.

Mathematics

MEASUREMENT

The Year 2 students will:

- measure and compare objects based on capacity
- · measure and compare objects based on mass
- use appropriate informal units to measure objects.

NUMBER

The Year 1 students will:

- recognise, continue and create repeating patterns with numbers, symbols, shapes and objects
- use mathematical thinking to solve practical problems involving equal sharing and grouping.

The Year 2 students will:

- · recall and demonstrate multiplication facts for twos
- multiply numbers using repeated addition, equal groups and arrays
- divide numbers using repeated subtraction and equal grouping
- solve multi step problems that involve multiple operations.

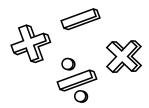
SPACE

The Year 1 students will:

- · make, compare and classify familiar shapes
- recognise familiar shapes and objects in the environment, identifying the similarities and differences between them.

The Year 2 students will:

 recognise, compare and classify shapes, referencing the number of sides and using spatial terms, such as 'opposite', 'parallel', 'curved' and 'straight'.



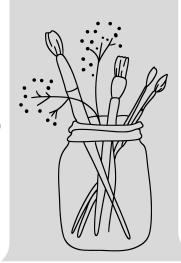




Visual Arts Jo Butler

The students will:

- explore texture and textiles to create a production costume accessory
- respond to a Book Week text through art making
- explore movement in line, colour (warm & cool) and shape
- create artworks using the elements of line, shape, colour and texture.

The students will:

- engage in hands on experiences to creatively solve problems (Year 1H)
- communicate design ideas through drawing and modelling (Year 1H)
- experiment with coding concepts on the Scratch Jr Platform, e.g. make a character move and talk (Year 2)
- create an animation using coding blocks on the Scratch Jr Platform (Year 2)

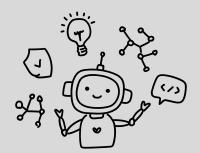




Physical Education lan Miller

The students will:

- engage in activities and games where they are continuing to develop their fundamental movement skills
- engage in activities and games where they demonstrate spatial awareness
- demonstrate growing competence in ball handling skills
- engage in athletics play based activities and games.



Performing Arts - Music Jennifer Marshall

The students will:

Year 1:

- explore the Music elements of Beat, Rhythm and timbre (sounds of instruments)
- experiment with percussion instruments to follow simple scores
- compose a piece of music using Graphic Notation.

Year 2:

- explore the Music elements of Rhythm and Beat in a variety of music
- investigate Kodaly symbols to play rhythm patterns
- explore the sound production of untuned percussion instruments.



Italian Jane Gilmartin and Matteo Maccio

The students will:

- explore ways to greet each other and talk about themselves (feelings, likes & dislikes)
- identify and describe fruits in Italian (colour & size)
- identify numbers and count objects in Italian beyond 10
- respond to familiar games and routines, such as 'Come ti chiami?' & 'Come stai?'
