- · Mary has many special qualities.

- Mary had many reasons as to why she agreed to be Jesus' Mother.
- · Mary ascended into heaven at the end of her earthly life.



Inquiry -

COMPELLING QUESTION:

How Do Things Move?

UNDERSTANDINGS

- · Push and pull are two different types of forces.
- The size and shape of objects affects how it moves.
- My senses help me to observe how objects move.
- Push and pull can change the direction of objects.
- Size, shape and material of an object affects how objects move.



Social and Emotional Learning

Question: What can I do if I need help?
Who do I go to if I need help?

UNDERSTANDINGS:

- Use personal and social skills when working with others in a range of activities.
- Identity when and from whom help can be sought.
- Discuss the importance of seeking help when problems are too big to solve alone.
- · Identify different types of relationships.







English

READING AND VIEWING

The students will:

- identify and describe the characters in a fairy tale
- answer literal questions about a familiar fairy tale
- sequence and retell the events of a familiar fairy tale

PHONICS (30 minute sessions 5 times a week) UFLI Foundations

The students will:

- be introduced to the sounds for the following letters, ff, ll, ss, zz and digraphs- ck, sh, th, wh, ph.
- make CVCC words Consonant Vowel -Consonant. Consonant words, such as ball, toll, rock
- make CCVC words- Consonant Consonant Vowel -Consonant words, such as ship, this
- read a decodable sentence or text with the sounds taught read irregular words, such as your, want, go, no, so.

WRITING

The students will:

- practise upper and lowercase letter formation focussing on the correct starting points and size
- continue sounding out words to include in sentences
- be introduced to sight words, such as your, want, go, no, so and be encouraged to include these when writing sentences
- write or copy simple sentences and draw pictures to illustrate their thinking.

GRAMMAR

The students will:

- complete a sentence using a conjunctions, such as 'but' and 'because'
- identify the various sentence types, such as questions or statements.

SPEAKING AND LISTENING

The students will:

- express their thoughts, ideas and needs with partners, in small groups and with the whole class
- be encouraged to wonder about things, ask and respond to simple questions
- be introduced to songs and stories that explore rhyme
- non-verbal communication skills, for example making eye contact, smiling and nodding.

Mathematics



NUMBER

The students will:

- make connections between number names, numerals and position in the sequence of numbers from zero to at least 20
- use subitising and counting strategies to quantify collections
- compare the size of collections to at least 20.

MEASUREMENT

The students will:

- identify the attributes of mass, capacity, length and duration
- use direct comparison strategies to compare objects and events.

STATISTICS:

The students will:

- collect data
- · sort objects
- compare data
- use data to answer 'yes' or 'no' questions
- create graphs reflecting information collected.

Learning At Home

- Practise recognising, counting and writing numbers to 30 and beyond.
- Read Heart Words and take home books with your child each day.
- Continue to foster good reading habits and an enjoyment of reading.
- Set aside a reading-friendly time each night to read and engage in a 'Book Talk' with your child. Here are some questions you might ask your child about their book:
 - What can you see? Who? What? Where?
 - How are these different? What will happen next?
 - What will happen if....? What made it happen?
- Practise counting using counting books.
- Reading, writing and spelling Heart Words.





Visual Arts Jo Butler

The students will:

- explore the art element of texture: rough and smooth
- experiment in colour mixing-using primary colours to make secondary
- participate in craft making, using a variety of textiles



Physical Education lan Miller

The students will:

- engage in activities and games where they are continuing to develop fundamental movement skills
- engage in activities and games where they are continuing to develop spatial awareness
- engage in independent and cooperative games
- play with a range of equipment and through participation in simple to more complex games.




Performing Arts - Music Jennifer Marshall

- explore the elements of dynamics and tempo in music and sounds
- respond to Vivaldi's 'The Four Seasons' by describing the images that the music creates
- rehearse and perform a dance and song scene for the school Production of The Wizard of Oz

The students will:

- continue to explore ways to greet each other and talk about themselves (age, name, and gender)
- use vocabulary to name members of their family and grandparents
- learn numbers 0-10.
